Danube Museum

- Located in Esztergom
- Founded in 1973, new permanent exhibition in 2001
- Interactive, family-friendly museum
- Awards:
 - Museum of the Year in Hungary, 2001
 - Special Commendation of EMF, 2003
 - Family-friendly Museum Award, 2005
 - Visitor-friendly Museum Award, 2009

Night of the Museums 2012

- for the seventh time in the museums and exhibition halls of Esztergom and Štúrovo
- 16th of June 2012
- various programs and special events between
 6 p.m. and midnight
- 15 participants (e.g. museum, gallery, archive,)
- more than 2000 visitors





GUIDE@HAND - Introduction

- Multilingual audio guide for foreigner and local tourists
- Guided walks from attractions to attractions
- Location based information about sights, services and events
- High-quality consumable content
- Available on mobile devices (iPhone, Android)...



GUIDE@HAND - Services (1)

- One- or two-hour-long enjoyable Guided walks
- Audio stories and voice instructions in various languages while walking
- Usage of offline or online interactive maps
- Displaying useful places (e.g. restaurants, entertainment, shops, etc.) on the map
- Possibility of standalone discovery of a town or a region



GUIDE@HAND - Services (2)

- No Internet costs during using the application
- Usage of indoor information system (integrated QR Code reader)
- Sharing experiences and reliving them
- Statistical data on the usage of the service
- Premium service providers



GUIDE@HAND – References

- Budapest (Tourism Walks, thematic walk based on the novel of Géza Ottlik, event locator)
- Esztergom (Interactive exhibition with QR codes, event locator at Night of Museums)
- Mátra (Special walk for hikers, presentation of the tourism, geographical and religious sites of this region.
- Tokaj Region (complex tourism package)
- Eger (complex tourism package)
- Košice (Tourism Walks)



Virtual walk with QR codes


- 10 QR codes in the permanent exhibition
 - 5 of these were related to actual objects and installations in the exhibit.
 - 5 QR codes were placed on the floor of the map room depicting Hungary from space.













Further Development

- to gain a deeper understanding of the exhibited objects
- it is up to the visitor how much they "consume"
- the provision of supplemental information, films and audio becomes simpler in this way
- making it easier to keep information fresh and up to date
- it does not necessarily require an investment in equipment by the museum
- more cost efficient for the museum and more convenient for the visitors
